Hidden Threads: Intellect, Diversity, and Religious Freedom was a year-long project led by Mercer undergraduate Bekehm Mohn who noticed a lack of recognition for LGBTQ+ Mercerians. The initiative is a part of Mercer's Applied-Social-Justice Certification program and headed by the student-ran organization My Name Matters Campaign. This book was designed to explore and analyze the complex historical events leading up to Mercer University and the Georgia Baptist Convention severing their longstanding 172-year-old relationship.
